MATTER OF HUMAN RESOURCES

Dotty had provided a conversation piece to help employees understand what it means to be self-insured, she does have a few changes she wants to make prior to sending out to employees and will provide to Commissioners for approval. Dotty also announced the next Department Head is April 5th at 8:00. Next, recruitment around the County was reviewed. Dotty discussed the doors of the Annex Building that face 10th street and had requested them to be locked due to patrons coming in and using the basement restrooms for personal showers a few years back, then the problem started with the front doors. Dotty has asked the Sheriff and Security Team if cameras could be added to the Annex building to increase security. Todd feels our badges could be used for access to different locations, both Commissioner Watson and Hartman agree. Further discussion took place. Todd feels it would be a good idea to have cameras on the building that record 24/7 for a more secure building. Commissioners asked Dotty to get some quotes on cameras for the front and back doors of the Annex Building and then they will make a decision.

Attorney Cedric Hollabaugh, the City of Butler's attorney contacted Auditor Sleeper explaining that the City is interested in requesting the Commissioners to assign the Tax Sale Certificates for the following tax id #'s:

He states the property has been listed on tax sale for quite some time now, and the City has completed a Phase I and Phase II Environmental Assessment on the site. The results indicated there is some contamination on the site and that the City has been working with the Indiana Brownfields Program to obtain a comfort letter for the property. The City is interested in acquiring title to the property to continue the clean-up process.

Auditor Sleeper confirmed the properties have been listed on tax sale for many years now and explained that when the properties were listed for the 2022 Tax Sale the County listed and advertised four parcels that were to be sold and redeemed together, tax id #'s are listed below:

23-07-01-359-013, 23-07-01-359-014, 23-07-01-359-015 and 23-07-01-359-017 Auditor Sleeper contacted SRI and their attorney and it is highly recommended to not re-assign two of the four parcels. Attorney Hollabaugh clarified that they do want all four, and that if the City does not receive a comfort letter for the property then the City will not finish the re-assignment process and the four parcels will remain delinquent with the County.

MATTER OF DCCC FIRE INSPECTION AGREEMENT

DeKalb County Community Corrections has guidelines that must be followed according to the Indiana Association of Community Corrections Act Counties by the Residential Advisory Committee Guidelines for Community Corrections Adult Residential Service Providers. In these guidelines is states:

"A qualified person conducts fire inspections at least quarterly or at intervals approved by the fire authority having jurisdiction, following the procedures stated for variances, exceptions, or equivalences. Equipment is tested as specified by the manufacturer or the fire authority, whichever is more frequent."

The process indicators that would show our facility is compliant with the guidelines include: copies of completed internal inspections, records of equipment testing and documentation of qualifications of person who conducts fire inspections. The 'qualifications' are not listed anywhere in the guidelines, but is something the Commissioners questioned. Michelle Fosnaugh spoke with IDOC Residential Program Director and confirmed that our Residential Director can do the quarterly inspections, for example checking the fire extinguisher levels, after training, which we have in place now. However, the S-9 (3) requirements for equipment tested as specified by the manufacturer or the fire authority... is Johnson Controls, Koorsen, or an equivalent certified inspector. She stated that because we are a public building and because we house people this is a requirement. She is going to contact the IDOC jail standards inspector and the IDOC Hazard Controls person to see if she can get us documentation of these requirements that may be helpful.

Auditor Sleeper explained the jail uses Koorsen and has requested Shannon Talley from DCCC to reach out to the jail and then Koorsen to see if they would give us a deal if both departments use them.

DCCC received quotes from Johnson Controls that came in at \$1,170 for a one-year contract. Koorsen revised their quote after DCCC contacted them again and theirs came in at \$2,864.11 for a one-year contract.

Todd would like to see if Koorsen would make a deal if both DCCC and Sheriff's Office use their services. Auditor Sleeper will work on getting the information and return to the Commissioners.
