MATTER OF GIS INVOICE - SANBORN

GIS director Brad Stump presented invoices for services from Sanborn for parcel conversion for the GIS project. Monies were not appropriated for this purpose from the general fund at the time of budget reduction. It was decided that the amount for the invoices could be appropriated from the CCD fund and the auditor will advertise for this purpose for the December Council meeting.

MATTER OF CLERK

Clerk Jackie Rowan presented the proposed listing of precinct polling places for 2006. The list is complete pending approval of the commissioners.

Jackie requested direction and advice from the commissioners regarding jury polling for the Superior Court II. With the third court effective on January 1, 2006, it might be necessary for this polling to be completed prior to December 31, 2005 should a jury trial be called for. An announcement is anticipated later in the day to indicate that current prosecutor Monte Brown will be the new judge for this court

New Crimmins Jury Record Management software has been purchased for the clerk for jury selection. A disc is sent from the BMV to be used with the software which will also record the selection and produce the claim form for payment of the jurors.

MATTER OF SANTA'S CHALET

The auditor has received the customary request to place Santa's Chalet on the walk near the west entrance to the courthouse. The commissioners have no objection to continuing this Christmas season practice.

MATTER OF REPORT

IS director Jack Smith reported briefly on his attendance at a recent meeting in Indianapolis for data processing persons within county government. The main speaker at this meeting was DLGF director Melissa Henson. The main topics for discussion were the selection of a statewide software system, and the manner in which the DLGF will work with counties to establish guidelines and formats for reporting tax information.

MATTER OF SOLID WASTE DISTRICT

Commissioner Kaufman reported that the executive committee for the solid waste district has literally run out of ideas to support the solid waste program, and that a meeting is set for

January 6, 2006 to find solutions to the problems. It is hoped that all of the commissioners will attend. A Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) is being considered.

DEKALB COUNTY COMMISSIONERS RESOLUTION NUMBER 2005-R-25 DEKALB COUNTY CODE

Resolution of the Board of Commissioners of DeKalb County, Indiana, Approving an Extension of Family Medical Leave Act Coverage of a Specific Employee Upon Limited Condition

Whereas, the board of Commissioners (the "Board") of DeKalb County, Indiana, has previously adopted and approved for all employees a policy of extending those protections set forth in the Family Medical Leave act for the requisite time of twelve (12) weeks approved in said legislation; and

Whereas, the Board has been advised by Sheriff John Dennis that his employee Robert Woodward, a Merit Deputy Sheriff has sustained a medical condition, progressive in nature, that will not permit him to return to his regular employment as a Merit Deputy for the Sheriff's Department; and

Whereas, Robert Woodward has been a loyal and faithful employee of the Sheriff's Department for many years; and

Whereas, the Sheriff has a position of employment available for which Robert Woodward will have medical clearance, but said employment is a new job created by the DeKalb County Council to begin the first of the calendar year 2006, has offered said employment to /Robert Woodward to begin the first of

January, 2006, and which employment will necessitate said Robert Woodward resigning as a Merit Deputy; and

Whereas, the twelve (12) week Family Medical Leave Act protection of said Robert Woodward will terminate during the month of December and before the end of the month; and

Whereas, the Sheriff has requested that the Board consider extending the provisions of the Family medical leave Act to said Robert Woodward for a fixed term not to exceed thirty (30) days in duration, and in fact, through the end of the month of December, 2005; and

Whereas, the Board desires to afford the extension of the Family Medical Leave Act provisions to Robert Woodward, but only upon the limiting facts set forth herein.

NOW THERERORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of DeKalb County, Indiana, as follows:

- 1. The Family Medical Leave Act provisions in effect in this County and normally limited to twelve (12) weeks will be extended for Robert Woodward for a period beginning the end of the twelve weeks and to and including December 31, 2005.
- 2. The Board and the Auditor are hereby authorized to execute and attest to such documents as may be related to the extension of these benefits for and on behalf of said Robert Woodward as may be necessary to carry out the intention of this resolution.
- 3. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the adoption by the Board.
