## Approved Residential Facility Personal Items

Required uniform: All participants must provide and wear a uniform inside the facility.

1. "Crocs" Style sandals with back strap of a solid dark color
2. Two (2) Grey Sweatpants
3. Three (3) T- Shirts (Women- Navy Blue, Men- White)

Optional Interior Facility Clothing Items:

1. Three (3) pairs of pants
2. Six (6) Shirts
3. Eight (8) pairs Underwear
4. Eight (8) Pairs Socks
5. Three (3) Bras – No Underwire (Women)
6. Two (2) Plain pullover sweatshirt (Grey) – NO HOODIES
7. Two (2) pairs, plain, solid color shorts
8. **What you wear into the facility counts towards the items listed above**

Exterior Facility Clothing Items:

1. Two (2) Outside and /or Work Shoes
2. One (1) Outside Coat
3. One (1) Pair Thermal Underwear
4. One (1) Helmet
5. One (1) Pair of Overhauls if required for work or if traveling by moped/motorcycle

Non- Clothing Items:

1. One (1) Brush or Comb
2. A maximum of three (3) Hair ties, plain elastic band only
3. USB Cord not to exceed three (3) feet for cell phone charging
4. Two (2) Books (soft cover) – All books brought into the facility will become part of the facility library upon discharge of the participant. Romance novels and books depicting violent illustrations are prohibited.
5. Two (2) Religious Books
6. Up to three (3) photographs of family and friends. Individuals pictured must be fully clothed and the photograph small enough to fit inside the participant's locker.
7. One windup alarm clock (may be purchased through Commissary – if available)

-DCCC staff may determine the appropriateness of personal items, books and photographs, and have the discretion to prohibit these items.
