

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-R-13
DEKALB COUNTY CODE SECTION 9-1-1-37
DEKALB COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
SPEED LIMIT ON COUNTY ROAD 75A
FROM THE EAST BOUNDARY LINE OF 5149 COUNTY ROAD 75A
TO THE WEST BOUNDARY LINE OF 5098 COUNTY ROAD 75A

WHEREAS, the town limits of the Town of Newville, Indiana, have become more densely populated than it has been in the past. Based upon the density of the population in the Town of Newville, the DeKalb County Highway Superintendent has recommended to the DeKalb County Commissioners that the town limits of Newville be considered to be an "urban district" as that term is defined under Indiana Code 9-13-2-193; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Indiana Code 9-21-5-2, maximum speed limits in an urban district should be 30 m.p.h.; and,

WHEREAS, this will affect a segment of County Road 75A from the west end of Newville beginning at 5149 County Road 75A and ending on the east side of Newville on County Road 75A at 5098 County Road 75A on the west end of that property; and,

WHEREAS, the interests of the public from a safety standpoint will be enhanced by establishing the speed limit along that stretch of County Road 75A from the east boundary line of 5149 County Road 75A to the west boundary line of 5098 County Road 75A, at 30 m.p.h.; and,

WHEREAS, the DeKalb County Highway Superintendent has made a safety recommendation to the DeKalb County Commissioners that the speed limit on County Road 75A from the west end of Newville beginning at 5149 County Road 75A and ending on the east side of Newville on County Road 75A at 5098 County Road 75A on the west end of that property should be set at 30 m.p.h. in accordance with IC 9-21-5.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE DEKALB COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DEKALB COUNTY, INDIANA THAT:

Section 1. 30 MPH SPEED LIMIT: There is hereby established a maximum speed limit over and along County Road 75A from the east boundary line of 5149 County Road 75A to the west boundary line of 5098 County Road 75A, at 30 m.p.h.

Section 2. SPEED VIOLATIONS: Violators of the Ordinance may be charged with a traffic summons issued by any enforcement officer of any government jurisdiction on the roadway of County Road 75A from the west end of Newville beginning at 5149 County Road 75A and ending on the east side of Newville on County Road 75A at 5098 County Road 75A on the west end of that property, DeKalb County, Indiana.

2.1 The DeKalb County Prosecuting Attorney is authorized to prosecute any violation of this Ordinance.

2.2 Any Court of DeKalb County, Indiana, having general traffic jurisdiction shall be empowered to process such charges as violations of the law similar to other speeding violations of the Indiana Code.

2.3 Any existing penalties for such violations shall be applied to this Ordinance and be imposed for any such violations.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall become effective after passage of the third reading as adopted by the DeKalb County Commissioners and the publication of this Ordinance thereafter as required by law.

Section 4: Ordinance Codified. This DeKalb County Ordinance Number 2017-R-13 is passed and adopted on all three readings and shall be codified in the DeKalb County Code as Section 9-1-1-37 and appropriately indexed in the Code.

READ AND PASSED ON FIRST READING: Monday, June 5, 2017.


READ AND PASSED SECOND READING: Monday, June 12, 2017.





CONTINUATION OF MEETING OF
DEKALB COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
ON MAY 25, 2017, CONTINUED FROM MAY 22, 2017

MATTER OF ARCHITECT INTERVIEWS

The Commissioner met beginning at 10:00 am, with all three Commissioners present. Commissioner Don Grogg stated that the continuation of the meeting was primarily for interview of two architects from the Fort Wayne area to perform architectural services for the Community Corrections project only. He advised that the site is not yet selected and that the successful architectural firm would help with looking at the infrastructure that needs to be put in place as well as the plans for the structure. He indicated we are still looking at other sites and confirmed that Community Corrections and Work Release through Kelly Knauer would be in this facility.

Elevatus was the first firm to make a presentation. Tony Vie made the presentation going through the booklet about the firm. Cory Miller, a partner in Elevatus and Cory Dietz were also present. Their major focus was the fact that they are a small firm that would give personal attention and would be willing to work with the County, making recommendations, but letting the County choose. They will be present at every meeting, and emphasized that they look forward to a collaborative approach with Rod Miller, Kelly Knauer of Community Corrections, and Bonnie Emerson of Community Corrections. They emphasized that they had worked with Rod Miller on the feasibility study some four to five years ago and were still committed to the project. Tony Vie will be the County's contact person and will remain so. They hoped that the construction process could be completed within nine to ten months, barring winter weather problems. Tony emphasized that Tim Bowman was the individual in charge of doing the specifications, and that he has set up specifications for similar projects. Elevatus has no problem working with Steve Fetters as our liaison, and emphasized that their charges did not include any reimbursable for travel or for anything else.

The second architectural firm to make a presentation was DLZ. Miguel "Mike" Trevino is a partner with DLZ and will be involved in the project. Scott Carnegie is the Criminal Justice Specialist for the firm. DLZ passed out a booklet, referencing the experience of DLZ and correctional facilities throughout the State of Indiana, and discussed specifically projects in St. Joseph County, LaPorte, Morgan County, and Howard County. They discussed the impact of House Bill 1006 on local county jail population. They also outlined their process for project cost management, and indicated their fee would be a range between 5% and 8%, or a flat fee, whichever the County preferred.


MATTER OF HEALTH INSURANCE


The Commissioners discussed correspondence and information received from Andrew Loehr of Galligher, our broker on health insurance. The Commissioners advised that he was very pleased to advise that PHP stepped up and cut their bid by \$80,000, which is in addition to the \$30,000 in savings by eliminating the HRA plan. In addition, PHP will do all of the training, which will likewise save in the long run. Furthermore, PHP offered a two year contract at the same pricing, which is likely to amount to a huge savings on the part of the County. It was proposed that the \$80,000 in additional savings be passed on half and half to the employees and the County. Randy Deetz made a motion to approve this proposal from PHP and to allocate the \$80,000 in savings equally among the employees and the County. Jackie Rowan seconded the motion and all approved.

MATTER OF SELECTION OF ARCHITECT

Randy summarized for the Commissioners that both firms had good presentation. He liked that Elevatus had a more personable approach, and all three Commissioners, Steve Feters, and Bonnie Emmerson agreed. Steve indicated he was disappointed that DLZ had no firm fee to quote. Randy Deetz made a proposal to accept the proposal from Elevatus as our architect, but to propose that the County would accept it if they would reduce their fee from 5.9% to 5.4%. Don Grogg seconded the motion. Motion approved two to one with Jackie Rowan voting no.

There being no further business to come before the Commissioners, the meeting was adjourned.
